Do you remember the craze for ... ?

A The Slinky

When shipyard worker Richard James watched a spring fall off his desk in 1943, he had a brilliant idea – why not expand the spring to 27 metres, put plastic at each end, call it the Slinky and sell it as a toy? Its unique selling point was that, given a push, it would 'walk' downstairs by coiling and uncoiling itself. After a few early problems the Slinky went from strength to strength, with brightly-painted, neon and gold-plated models being used as everything from stress-relievers for overworked business people to ultra-modern light fittings and even home-made radio aerials for American soldiers in Korea.

B The Rubik's Cube

The craze for the Rubik's Cube occupied the brightest minds of a generation in the early 1980s. It had six sides divided into nine squares. When first purchased, the squares on each side were all the same colour, but each side could be turned through 360 degrees and the idea was to mix up the colours and then try to get them back to their original state. When you consider that there were 43,252,003,274,489,856,000 possible colour patterns, it is clear that this was no easy task. Hungarian inventor Ernő Rubik said its purpose was to give his architecture students greater experience in dealing with three-dimensional objects, but his plan was surely to take over the world while everyone was going crazy trying to solve his puzzle.

C The Hula-Hoop

The game of rolling a circle of wood or bamboo along the ground and chasing after it goes back centuries, but the idea of putting it round your waist and then frantically moving your hips to stop it falling down was born in the America of the 1950s. The plastic Hula-Hoop was invented in 1958 and in six months the inventors had sold 20 million of them at \$1.98 each. The greatest figure in Hula-Hoop folklore was undoubtedly Elvis Presley and scenes of mass Hula-ing appear in his movies with alarming regularity. He also recorded the movement's theme song *Rock A Hula Baby*. The craze reached its height in that first year and many teenagers were hospitalized with bruised ribs and pulled muscles as they went on to ever more complicated moves.

D Clackers

Clackers were two plastic balls linked by an arrangement of strings. The object was to move the balls so that they hit each other with a *clack* above and below your hand. However, such was the skill required, pupils were often carried off playgrounds on stretchers with bruised wrists and black eyes (from uncontrolled balls) and burnt hands (from the rubbing action of the strings). There was even a mini outbreak of broken wrists among Clacker fans, followed by stories (widely believed to have been spread by angry teachers) of pieces of plastic from 'exploding' balls damaging the eyes of unwary enthusiasts. This eventually led to Clackers being forbidden in the majority of educational establishments.

E Deely-Boppers

There is a lot of competition, but Deely-Boppers are the strongest candidates for the Silliest Craze of the 20th Century award. A plastic headband supported a pair of flexible antennae like those on an insect's head, on the ends of which could be anything 'mad', from shiny stars to flashing lights. Deely-Boppers were particularly popular with disc jockeys in general and with one in particular, who reached the peak of his career with an appearance on a Christmas TV pop show wearing a pair of Deely-Boppers topped with sparkling Christmas decorations. The drawbacks of this craze, apart from making the wearer look a complete idiot, were that the headband was so tight that not only did it result in agonizing headaches but it also left strange marks when removed after a hard day's Bopping.

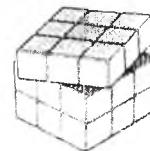
